Rangers teams will participate in the Northwest Spring Hockey League. Some travel to other rinks is required. Teams will play an 8 game season, 4 home and 4 away, in addition to an end-of-season tournament. Teams will receive a minimum of 8 practices during the spring season and the players must attend evaluations. The NWSHL allows up to two tier two players per team. AAA players are not allowed in the NWSHL. Any questions should be directed to Alex Alessi, Niles Hockey Director at 847-297-8010.

Pre-requisite and Registration: All players must be registered with USA HOCKEY and supply confirmation at the time of registration. Players not currently registered must register online with USA HOCKEY (www.usahockey.com) after April 1st for the 2025-26 season. Returning Rangers players can register for the Spring season online by emailing our front desk staff this completed packet of forms to our email at Iceland@niles-parks.org New Rangers players will need to sign up in person at the IceLand front desk, as we will need to see a copy of the players birth certificate, go over available jersey numbers, ordering information and get an updated copy of the players USA Hockey registration. Players who have not played on a Rangers team in the past will need an evaluation and approval of the Hockey Director before enrolling with the Rangers. Rangers players who played for our U6 team in the Fall and are supposed to move up to the U8 level in the Spring, must be approved by the Hockey Director.

Requirements: Complete equipment is required. New Bantam & Midget level players who previously haven't taken a checking clinic must attend a body contact clinic before playing in any full-check games. A checking clinic at Niles will take place before games are played. Space is limited so don't delay in signing up. Players must provide a white and blue Rangers jersey from the fall season to utilize during the Spring. Jerseys and socks are NOT included in the fees. New Ranger players will have to purchase their jerseys and socks for the spring season and can get that purchasing information through our staff at the IceLand front desk.

### NILES RANGERS HOCKEY PROGRAM PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT AGREEMENT

As a parent/legal guardian of a child involved in the Niles Rangers Hockey Program, I agree to abide by and follow the rules and guidelines below.

- I will promote the emotional and physical well-being of the athletes ahead of any personal desire to win.
- I will remember that my child plays hockey for his/her enjoyment, not mine.
- I will encourage good sportsmanship through my actions, by demonstrating positive support for all players.
- I will provide support for coaches and officials working with the athletes to provide a positive experience for all
- I will demand my athlete treat all players, coaches, officials, and spectators with dignity in language, attitude, behavior, and mannerisms.
- I will inform the coach of any physical disability or ailment that may affect the safety of my athlete or the safety
  of others.
- I will respect the property and equipment used at any sports facility, both home and away.
- I will adhere to the Niles IceLand CoVid safety protocols.
- I will adhere to each outside rinks individual CoVid safety protocols during away games.

I understand that by signing this document I am agreeing to support and promote this Parent/Legal Guardian Code of Conduct Agreement. Further, my failure to comply with this Agreement or my participation in any of the defined **CONDUCT SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINE** will result in disciplinary action, up to and including expulsion from The Niles Rangers Hockey Program.

#### CONDUCT SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINE

Examples of words or actions which will constitute a violation of the **Code** include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Making physical contact with any player, coach, official, league representative, arena personnel, or spectator;
- Taunting or threatening any player, coach, official, league representative, arena personnel, or spectator;
- Going into the locker/dressing room of an opposing team or obstructing their access to or exit from said room and arena;
- Going into the officials' locker/dressing room or obstructing their access to or exit from said room and arena;
- Using profane and/or vulgar language or mannerisms;
- Going onto the ice surface;
- The throwing of any object onto the ice surface, into the player area(s), or at another individual;
- Pounding or climbing on the glass;
- Defacing or damaging property belonging to any individual, team, association, or arena;
- Being involved in any activity that would warrant the summoning of law enforcement officials.
- Not adhering to the CoVid safety protocols at IceLand/or surrounds rinks during games.
